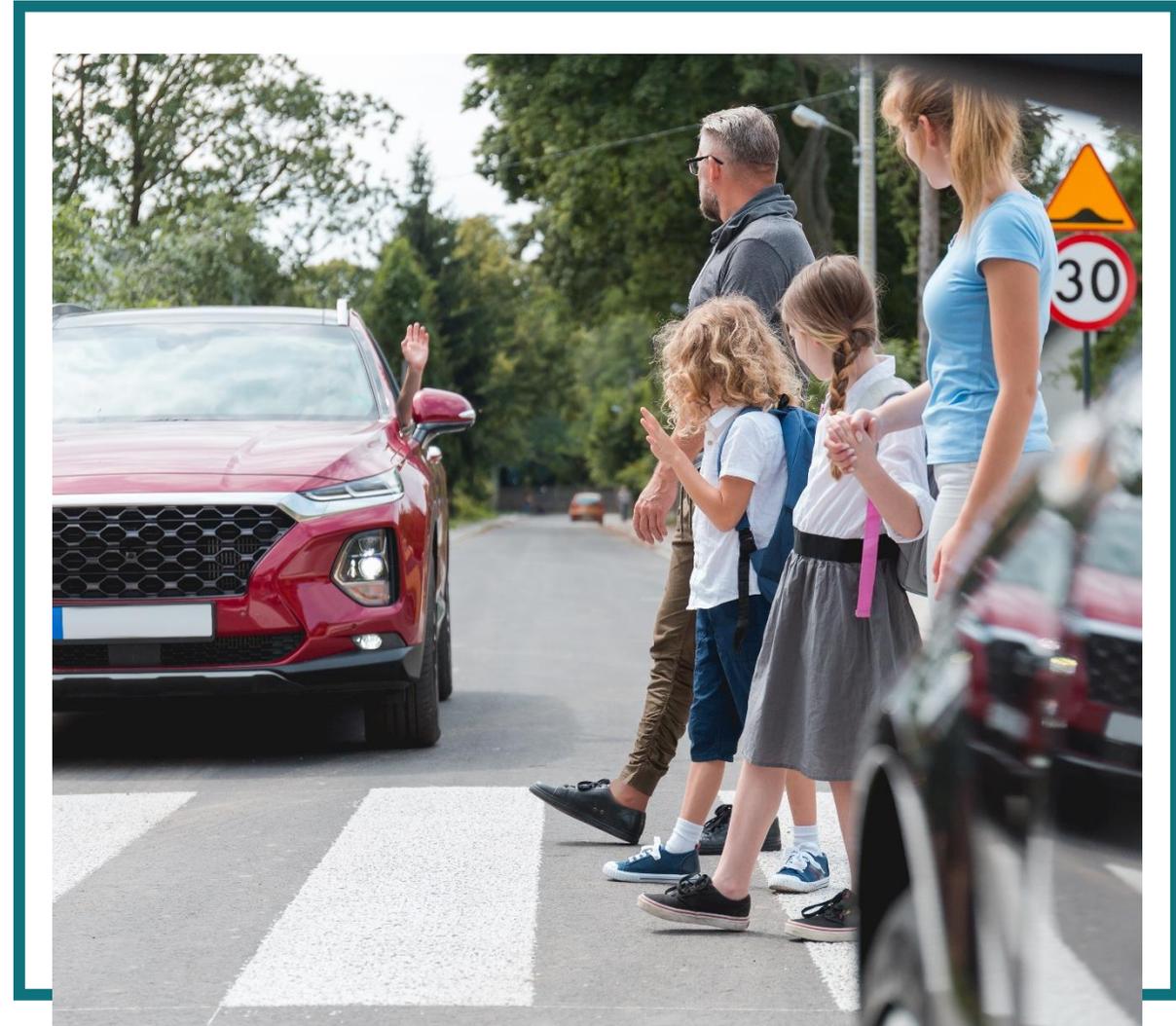

## What can a responsible driver do?

- Adopt **safe behaviors** when driving.
- **Avoid using the cell phone** while driving.
- **Avoid the use of alcohol or drugs** whenever you drive.
- **Do not overtake where this is prohibited** or when there are no conditions to perform such a maneuver.
- Maintain an **appropriate speed** for the conditions of the road, the weather, and traffic.
- **Anticipate situations**, looking as far ahead as possible.
- **Respect cyclists, pedestrians, and vulnerable people** such as children or the elderly.



- **Use child restraint systems** according to the age and in compliance with the local law.
- Keep an **appropriate safe distance** from the vehicle ahead.
- **Signal** your maneuvers.
- Look for **safe sites** to stop.
- In case you feel tired, **stop and rest**.
- **Do not get involved in quarrels** with other road users.
- **Keep your vehicle in good conditions and make the required inspections**, according to the vehicle's manufacturer.
